INTRODUCTION

The Kairology Charitable Trust is a made up of business people who are committed to improving the lives of men and women prison, and their families, with the aim of positive and sustainable change in their lives. The term Kairology is an extension of the Greek word Kairos, which Jesus used when referring to today/now the time has come, ie now is the time/season or correct/appointed moment.

Manhood, Womasculi and Personhood studies are faith and relationship based, with the precept that social wellness is mostly determined by the quality of relationships. Our studies cover these relational aspects by enabling people to better understand themselves and others (Personhood), to understand their relationship with God; and to build positive relationships with their partner (Marriage), their parents and their children (Parenthood). The healthy functioning of these relationships will usually be a good indicator of the state of the person and how well they fit into society.

Awareness of this, and the healing of past and present relationship issues, can and have made a huge difference in a very positive way for the future of many the participants of these studies, mainly men in prison, and also people in the wider community.

This study was written and first used in 2007, with the input and involvement of prisoners. It has been used in New Zealand prisons, with support and sponsorship of Prison Fellowship and the Chaplaincy Service. Currently the Kairology Studies are being delivered in prisons and communities in New Zealand, Fiji and Papua New Guinea. Around 3000 participants have used this study with positive permanent life-changing results in their personal faith journey and in their relationships. People's lives are being changed and renewed as they approach and manage family life very differently.

PERSONHOOD: SESSION 1

The Blueprint of Personhood (Personhood from God's design and purpose)

CONTEXT: This is the first module in the series looking at personhood, marriage and parenthood. The personhood module (5 sessions) is the basis for the whole study, then 5 on marriage and 5 on parenthood. Ideally you will also meet for a final summary session, presentation and/or graduation. Personhood looks at humanity from a biblical perspective, world view, and personal view, and gives the opportunity for you to rethink and re-establish your own personhood and how you portray and live out your life.

- Understanding the purpose of mankind
- Reviewing personal values
- · Looking to future possibility and personal change

Five sessions

The five sessions are:

- 1. Blueprint of Personhood
- 2. Personhood Purpose and Context
- 3. Man and Woman in Relationship
- 4. The Person You Are
- 5. New Person in Practice

What is the purpose of humankind?

Let's begin by looking at the beginning of humanity according to the bible in Genesis.

Genesis 1:26-31

²⁶ Then God said, "Let us make man in our likeness. Let them rule over the fish in the waters and the birds of the air. Let them rule over the livestock and over the whole earth. Let them rule over all of the creatures that move along the ground." 27 So God created man in his own likeness. He created him in the likeness of God. He created them as male and female.²⁸ God blessed them. He said to them, "Have children and increase your numbers. Fill the earth and bring it under your control. Rule over the fish in the waters and the birds of the air. Rule over every living creature that moves on the ground." 29

Then God said, "I am giving you every plant on the face of the whole earth that bears its own seeds. I am giving you every tree that has fruit with seeds in it. All of them will be given to you for food.³⁰ "I am giving every green plant to all of the land animals and the birds of the air for food. No-one can possibly know what life means, what the world means, what anything means, until they find purpose.

Paul, one of the followers of Jesus, ended up in prison several times, just for spreading the message of the gospel. So, he had first-hand experience of being in prison. But the important thing Paul draws attention to is that he was able to find a purpose in whatever circumstances he found himself in. This is what he says in a letter:

2 Timothy 1:8 -10

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⁸......don't be ashamed of me, his prisoner. Instead, join with me as I suffer for the good news. God's power will help us do that. ⁹God has saved us. He has chosen us to live a holy life. It wasn't because of anything we have done. It was because of his own **purpose** and grace. Through Christ Jesus, God gave us that grace even before time began. ¹⁰It has now been made known through the coming of our Saviour, Christ Jesus. He has destroyed death. Because of the good news, he has brought life out into the light. That life never dies.

Without a clear purpose, life is wasted. You are robbed of being useful, and rob others of what you are capable of achieving for them. With purpose comes <u>abundance</u> and <u>fulfilment</u>.

For a building:

- the vision of the end is at the beginning (the picture, the <u>concept</u>, the blueprint, the plans)
- the purpose is in the mind of the maker, so we follow his instructions
- the purpose determines nature, design and features
- the purpose is to complete the building to fulfil our potential and be purposeful
- the finished building is completion for people of God this is about being Christ-like
- the rest is the process

Focus on purpose; don't get lost in the process!

Sir Christopher Wren was the architect of St Paul's Cathedral in London. A young apprentice passed him one day, and Wren asked him what he was doing. The apprentice said he was carrying some bricks. Wren said, no - you are building a great vast cathedral for the glory of God.

Remember God's purpose and model for people from Genesis.

Foundation - solid, dependable, present (even though unseen), stability, security

Inheritance – a heritage and legacy, not governed by the past but creating the future

Presence – Adam & Eve were in God's presence, learning their purpose under God:

- 1. Relationship, fellowship, communion and covenant with Him
 - 2. Working to sustain and renew the earth.

REMEMBER: the past is not the future; we can choose not to be victims of history or our circumstances!

Ephesians 5, Colossians 3 and 1 Peter – these passages speak of love for your wife as Christ loved the church (a command, not a request), giving self in love and purity; submit to your husband as the head (as Christ is head of the church).

NOTE: We both submit to one-another out of LOVE, CONSIDERATION and RELATIONSHIP

Five Principles of Marriage

- 1. **Covenant:** commitment; promise; binding for life; die to self; two people as one new person; no escape clauses.
- 2. **Responsibility** (OAR see Personhood 'Above The Line People'); leave & cleave: step out and step in (both, together); forsaking all others; secure & fulfilled partnership and life companion to encourage, support and comfort; husbandry as Christ is to the church; leader, guardian; faithful.
- 3. **Equal partner:** bond and unity; intimacy; joint responsibility; don't confuse humility with inferiority; gift not possession; equality is key.
- 4. **Selfless and giving:** giving of self "I will"; serving one-another; sacrificial; giving recognition; body, mind, emotions, spirit, possessions; abilities. Giving is never owning!
- 5. Fruitful: our success seen in one-another; jointly purposeful; productive; procreation

The new dimension

Matthew 5: 28 *But here is what I tell you. Do not even look at a woman in the wrong way. Anyone who does has already committed adultery with her in his heart.*

Matthew 18:18 (The context here is broader relationships, but it is appropriate to marriage relationships). "What I'm about to tell you is true. What you lock on earth will be locked in heaven. What you unlock on earth will be unlocked in heaven.

Matthew 19:4-6 *A Jesus replied, "Haven't you read that in the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female'? (Genesis 1:27) Fe said, 'That's why a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife. The two will become one.' (Genesis 2:24) Fe they are no longer two, but one. So a man must not separate what God has joined together."*

Romans 7:2-3 ² For example, by law a married woman is joined to her husband as long as he is living. But suppose her husband dies. Then the marriage law no longer applies to her. ³ But suppose that married woman gets married again while her husband is still alive. Then she is called a woman who commits adultery. But suppose her husband dies. Then she is free from that law. She is not guilty of adultery even if she marries another man.

Ephesians 5:22-29

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²² Wives, follow the lead of your husbands as you follow the Lord. ²³ The husband is the head of the wife, just as Christ is the head of the church. The church is Christ's body. He is its Saviour. ²⁴ The church follows the lead of Christ. In the same way, wives should follow the lead of their husbands in everything.

²⁵ Husbands, love your wives. Love them just as Christ loved the church. He gave himself up for her. ²⁶ He did it to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her with water and the word. ²⁷ He did it to bring her to himself as a brightly shining church. He wants a church that has no stain or wrinkle or any other flaw. He wants a church that is holy and without blame.

²⁸ In the same way, husbands should love their wives. They should love them as they love their own bodies. Any man who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹ After all, people have never hated their own bodies. Instead, they feed and care for their bodies. And that is what Christ does for the church. ³⁰ We are parts of his body. ³¹ Scripture says, "That's why a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife. The two will become one." MARRIAGE – SESSION 7

Connecting and Establishing (relationship for the journey)

No matter how much we prepare for marriage, one day we are single, and the next we are married! So the marriage itself is very much the beginning of *being married*. There's a lot of work to do in connecting and establishing our married relationship. We have made a covenant commitment to one-another, so no matter what came before, we have a new relationship to establish together. That requires communication and agreement, and setting new boundaries for ourselves and those around us. *This couple is a new creation.* That's why we celebrate!

Let's look at this in an overview model – **The River**. This is a picture of marriage that should be helpful, whatever your culture or background. Discuss this picture before moving on further.

1 CONNECTING

First become a respectful friend – why?

Part of the relationship is 'falling in love' – what is that, and what's your experience?

Falling in love has been described as:

"to have a revelation, vision or insight to power and potential." (*Mike Mason: Mystery of Marriage*)

What else holds you together?



Name and claim

When two rivers join they usually take the name of one, and that river continues as one. Is there anything wrong with that for you? Some regard it as signifying possession and dominance (wrong!) rather than <u>belonging and equality</u> in relationship (right!). Taking on the man's surname (or combining them) may be unpopular and irrelevant in some cultures, but it is profound! It provides:

- A sense of belonging to <u>one-another</u>, and joint 'claim' in a loving relationship
- An identity in the community for the whole family
- Mutual responsibility for the family name and reputation

Promises (or vows) provide the connection and commitment. What do they mean? What did you learn when we looked at the vows last time? 78

How might you 'bolt the back door' to ensure you keep your vows and the connection is real and permanent (no get-out clauses)? 79

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Note down any areas in which you personally might be vulnerable or at risk, and what you can do to build strength and keep your boundary.

2 ESTABLISHING

Look back at the *House of Being* Model. How is this relevant to establishing your marriage, as well as establishing yourself? **Joshua 24:15** *But as for me and my family, we will serve the LORD.*

If you are, or have been married, consider what your expectations were at the point of marriage, and list them on the left. Then on the right note down what this was like in reality. This applies to any situation – we have to juggle and negotiate between these two.

MARRIAGE – SESSION 8

Love and Sex (getting it right)

The greatest magic and mystery of marriage is getting things in the right order. No matter how traditions and fashions come and go, we know that what works best is God's pattern for marriage:

needs \rightarrow male and female attraction \rightarrow friendship \rightarrow love \rightarrow marriage \rightarrow sex \rightarrow procreation

We are human, so we meet problems and challenges with this pattern. And when we work with a different pattern we just create greater chances and things going wrong. That's why we need to follow the Maker's Handbook in this huge area of life.

1 LOVE

Let's look first at love. There are different words for love in ancient languages. In Greek, *agape* is charitable, selfless, unconditional love, like a parent to a child. *Phileo* is brotherly human love and compassion, and *eros* is sexual love. In Hebrew language, *ahava* is love of God, and also interpersonal love. *Chen* is grace, *Hesed* is compassion and loving-kindness.

Love is a range of feelings and emotions that bind a couple together and is expressed verbally, emotionally, spiritually and physically. The bible is filled with love, and God is the source author of love and life.

Look back and remind yourself of The River picture. Falling in love is about submitting to your feelings and emotions, meeting your deepest needs. Marriage is giving ALL that you ARE to one-another in life-long intimate partnership, based on your love for one-another.

If you have experienced falling in love, try to recall what it was like, how you felt, and what you went through at the beginning. Get back in touch with how it felt, and describe it: 88

Love is very practical. It is not just a warm fuzzy feeling. Let love rule, and be the foundation. Love drives out fear. Let's look at a biblical picture of love:

1 Corinthians 13 : Let's look at this amazing passage once again:

¹³Suppose I speak in the languages of human beings and of angels. If I don't have love, I am only a loud gong or a noisy cymbal.

²Suppose I have the gift of prophecy. Suppose I can understand all the secret things of God and know everything about him. And suppose I have enough faith to move mountains. If I don't have love, I am nothing at all

.³ Suppose I give everything I have to poor people. And suppose I give my body to be burned. If I don't have love, I get nothing at all.

⁴Love is patient. Love is kind. It does not want what belongs to others. It does not brag. It is not proud. ⁵It is not rude. It does not look out for its own interests. It does not easily become angry. It does not keep track of other people's wrongs.

⁶Love is not happy with evil. But it is full of joy when the truth is spoken. ⁷It always protects. It always trusts. It always hopes. It never gives up.

Consider the truths here, and the practical expression of love (in all relationships and circumstances) that this represents. We'll come back to this for some homework.

Another important set of qualities that come from love, from the very spirit of God, are the fruits that come from following His pattern:

Galatians 5:19-23

¹⁹ What the sinful nature does is clear. It enjoys sexual sins, impure acts and wild living. ²⁰ It worships statues of gods. It also worships evil powers. It is full of hatred and fighting. It is full of jealousy and fits of anger. It is interested only in getting ahead. It stirs up trouble. It separates people into their own little groups. ²¹ It wants what others have. It gets drunk and takes part in wild parties. It does many things of that kind. I warn you now as I did before. People who live like that will not receive God's kingdom.

²² But the fruit the Holy Spirit produces is love, joy and peace. It is being patient, kind and good. It is being faithful²³ and gentle and having control of oneself. There is no law against things of that kind.

This is a clear contrast of the choices we make for life, of which love is the central core. We need to test these lists alongside our personhood, our marriage, and our parenthood.

The key is this: love is about putting others first, about being sacrificial, and about serving. This is for many of us opposite to our nature. Love is powerful – it overcomes anger and brings us into perspective.

Love is a decisive choice: our mind, emotions, heart, soul, body and spirit should all be an expression of our decision to love. And once we've committed to our partner, and produced children, our love for them should be natural and unconditional. In making vows, we often promise to cherish our spouse – this means to take pleasure in, care for, to value, prize, treasure, appreciate, hold in high esteem, nourish and nurture. This is demanding stuff – no wonder we mess up sometimes! We are designed to give and receive love; it is also the most important commandment from God.

Romans 12:9-10

⁹Love must be honest and true. Hate what is evil. Hold on to what is good. ¹⁰Love each other deeply. Honour others more than yourselves. ¹¹Never let the fire in your heart go out. Keep it alive. Serve the Lord.

John 15:12

¹² "Here is my command. Love each other, just as I have loved you. ¹³ No one has greater love than the one who gives his life for his friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command. (See also 1 John 4:7-21)

Before we move on to sex, let's remind ourselves of something very important. Refer back to the **Our Purpose as People** from Personhood. Notice that we are called to give and serve, not to be demanding and getting. Think about this again with regard to LOVE and SEX. Our purpose is to GIVE. *It is in giving that we receive.*

<u>2 SEX</u>

So, what is sex? You may think you know, but do you really?

Seven principles of sex:

- 1. Sex was designed by God, for His purposes in marriage (as in session 6)
- 2. It is creative it produces the miracle of new life!
- 3. He designed sex for the bodily union and love expression between husband and wife
- 4. Sex is designed to be about love and giving (satisfaction), not lust and getting (gratification)
- 5. Sex is an ultimate intimacy
- 6. Sex is a physical sign of a spiritual act
- 7. Sex is one of our very basic human needs and can be vital to our health and well-being

Sex is a natural progressive part of romance, union and oneness. It's an expression of love, emotion and giving. It is a spiritual experience of intimacy and pleasure. It is an amazing and ongoing celebration of marriage. The bible describes it as 'to know' a person in the context of marriage. Outside marriage it's usually described in the bible as 'to lie with'. This gives us the sense of casual sex as a very distinct act to sexual love in marriage.

Sex can go very wrong, and creates life's soap operas. Let's look at a few fundamentals:

1 Sex before of marriage – also known as fornication

God designed sexual intercourse to be within marriage because it's where men and women find security in relationships through commitment, and where children also feel security in the permanent togetherness of their parents. That is the ideal for family and for society.

2 Sex with another person, outside the marriage – adultery

Faithfulness is close to God's heart, and is essential for trust and stability in relationships, and keeps the body, mind and spirit healthy – for everyone. (See Romans 13:9)

3 Communication

When problems occur in sexual relationship, we need to be open and communicative. It's the only way issues can be solved. Sex is a form of communication in itself, so we should make sure we speak about it and listen to the needs of our partner.

4 Withdrawal

Sex is a blessing, not a weapon, and should never be used as a way to punish or control our partner. Men and women are made differently, and this can be frustrating. We must hold on to what we read in the scriptures at the beginning of this session. We must also respect the needs and wishes of each other as well as putting forward our own.

Think about your own life and situation. What dramas have you created or been part of? You may have been a perpetrator, a victim, or both. Consider a situation where sex took over, or where love may have overcome. Consider where you need to take responsibility, or where you may need to consider forgiveness.

Jot down a couple of thoughts in session, and continue with this on your own. Work with a trusted friend, your facilitator, or a chaplain, if you need help. 90

⁵ His anger lasts for only a moment. But his favour lasts for a person's whole life. Sobbing can remain through the night. But joy comes in the morning. ¹¹ You turned my loud crying into dancing. You removed my black clothes and dressed me with joy.¹² So my heart will sing to you. I can't keep silent. LORD, my God, I will give you thanks forever.

Romans 1:24-27

²⁴ So God let them go. He allowed them to do what their sinful hearts wanted to. He let them commit sexual sins. They polluted one another's bodies by what they did.²⁵ They chose a lie instead of God's truth. They worshiped and served created things. They didn't worship the Creator. But he must be praised forever. Amen.²⁶ So God let them go. They were filled with shameful longings. Their women committed sexual acts that were not natural.²⁷ In the same way, the men turned away from their natural love for women. They burned with sexual longing for each other. Men did shameful things with other men. They suffered in their bodies for all the twisted things they did.

Romans 6:11-14 ¹¹ In the same way, consider yourselves to be dead as far as sin is concerned. Now that you believe in Christ Jesus, consider yourselves to be alive as far as God is concerned.¹² So don't let sin rule your body, which is going to die. Don't obey its evil longings. ¹³ Don't give the parts of your body to serve sin. Don't let them be used to do evil. Instead, give yourselves to God. You have been brought from death to life. Give the parts of your body to him to do what is right.¹⁴ Sin will not be your master. Law does not rule you. God's grace has set you free.

Romans 13:8-10

⁸ Pay everything you owe. But you can never pay back all the love you owe each other. Those who love others have done everything the law requires. ⁹ Here are some commandments to think about. "Do not commit adultery." "Do not commit murder." "Do not steal." "Do not want what belongs to others." (<u>Exodus 20:13–15,17</u>; <u>Deuteronomy 5:17–19,21</u>) These and other commandments are all included in one rule. Here's what it is. "Love your neighbour as you love yourself." (<u>Leviticus 19:18</u>) ¹⁰ Love does not harm its neighbour. So love does everything the law requires.

1 Corinthians 6:18-20

¹⁸ Keep far away from sexual sins. All the other sins a person commits are outside his body. But sexual sins are sins against one's own body.¹⁹ Don't you know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit? The Spirit is in you. You have received him from God. You do not belong to yourselves. ²⁰ Christ has paid the price for you. So use your bodies in a way that honours God. (See also 1 Thessalonians 4:1-12)

1 Corinthians 7:3-5

³A husband should satisfy his wife's sexual needs. And a wife should satisfy her husband's sexual needs.⁴The wife's body does not belong only to her. It also belongs to her husband. In the same way, the husband's body does not belong only to him. It also belongs to his wife. ⁵You shouldn't stop giving yourselves to each other except when you both agree to do so. And that should be only to give yourselves time to pray for a while. Then you should come together again. In that way, Satan will not tempt you when you can't control yourselves.⁶

A lot to take in! Talk to your facilitator or chaplain if you need help with understanding.

MARRIAGE – SESSION 9

Maintenance and Growth (communication and conflict)

It's all great to connect, and to establish the marriage, but to get to the ocean you'll need to maintain things on the river as you go downstream.

Remember – *relationship is communication*. So to maintain the relationship over time, and to grow together, you have to work at communication. This involves developing what you started with – the things that brought you together in the first place, like your positive values and interests. If any of them fizzle out, replace them with something else – remember we said in Personhood that a void by nature has to be filled. So fill any gaps with something healthy that builds your marriage and family.

Clear communication comes in two basic elements:

What are ways in which we can check we understand others?

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- Here are some simple principles for communication in marriage:
 - 1. Love your partner; show affection
 - 2. Listen
 - 3. Keep your thinking aligned by talking, and get agreement on important matters
 - 4. Know the feelings of the other person observe and ask
 - 5. Affirm one-another pay compliments and build confidence
 - 6. Praise generously, criticise rarely (Proverbs 31:28-29)
 - 7. Keep giving mutual rather than self-fulfilment
 - 8. Take an interest in one-another's interests
 - 9. Invest time and do things together as a couple as well as with children
 - 10. Find her needs and seek to meet them
 - 11. Apologise and forgive these are choices
 - 12. Support your partner

Dealing with conflict – some principles:

- Don't let the sun go down on your anger •
- Don't create the conflict!
- Give and receive •
- Let go
- Give mutual support and respect
- Make boundaries
- Recognise wounds, share grief and move on

- Find common ground •
- "I feel" not "You always/never"
- Build resonance, not dissonance (harmony/in tune with each other) •
- Is yours a marriage worth making the effort for? If so keep working on it! Be heroic.
- Be proactive, rather than passive or aggressive •

Go back to the marriage promises or vows – that's what they are for. Go back to role-models of personhood and marriage – that's what they are for. Go back to the models we've used in Personhood modules

Remember that part of our purpose is to love, lead and serve. And servant leadership is two-way, respecting and honouring one-another.

MARRIAGE – SESSION 10

Renewing and Leading (stages of family life)

We all have a different experience and view of marriage.

For some of us it is a mystery, because we may not have had married parents, and may not be married ourselves. So we may have questions about the point or the purpose of marriage. Hopefully some of those questions have been answered in this study.

You may have lived in situations where you experienced poor examples of marriage, and weak role models – maybe grandparents, parents, or your personal marriage struggle. Perhaps one person was missing for whatever reason.

Or your experience and background may have provided really good examples of marriage, which you struggle to match up to.

Whatever your experience, you can only improve on it – if that's what you really want. So you have to make the choices and decisions, and you have to be willing to take on loving leadership in your marriage and family – whether this is now or in the future. It's never too late for a new start when people are willing to put in the effort. The journey from despair to joy relies on your driving!

Boundaries and relationships

In setting out on marriage, or in renewing a marriage, one essential aspect is getting your relationships with others sorted. We've looked at the marriage itself, so let's look at other relationships that can impact heavily on the quality of marriage and family.

What affects a new marriage enormously is not just how each partner adjusts to the other, but also how they adjust relationships individually and as a couple with other people – especially parents, extended family and personal friends. So here are three key principles to consider:

1 Leave and cleave

Becoming a couple means leaving parents and joining your spouse. That sounds simple, but it can be difficult if one or both partners still hold strong ties or reliance with parents. So it's critical to re-establish the relationship with parents (and others) and establish your boundaries quickly. You both now form a new family, and need to agree how you will relate to family and friends. Those relationships are still important, but your marriage relationship is *most* important. There may be strong cultural issues or family traditions that you need to manage carefully, but discuss and agree as a couple what your needs are, and how to express those needs to others in order to make your boundaries clear.

2 Mutual support

Most couples need their extended family around them. You will need support, and others will need support from you. But one partner forever dancing to the tune of a best friend or a parent will create problems early in the marriage. We need to be fair and flexible, but agree with one another what we can manage. Don't abandon your parents and then be surprised when they don't help out with children! Practical and emotional support is what family and friends are for, so let's make it mutual and fair. After all, you may already be relying on lots of wider family support.

3 Best friend

Realise that your best friend is now your husband or wife, not your buddy or your parent. Friendship brought you together, and you need to continue to build your friendship with your spouse if you really intend to maintain and grow your marriage.

If any of this has started badly, or changed for the worse over time, it's time to review it, renew it, and retake responsibility for your family. Sometimes cultural issues need to be understood and addressed, so you may need help from a chaplain or other trusted adviser.

What I need to review and renew, and build leadership is:



Forgiveness

We have touched on this in other sessions, so let's build on it further. There are lots of small things to forgive each other day by day, so make sure you do this so that you don't accumulate a heap of resentment. Remember that saying sorry is the other half of being forgiven. They go hand in hand if you want to stay hand in hand with your spouse!

Bigger issues demand a bigger dose of forgiveness. Being unfaithful, failing to love and care, or any other aspect of falling short of your vows may create huge problems. To overcome some issues you may need professional or independent help. Giving up, being superior, silent or stubborn - or being aggressive or passive - will solve nothing. Instead choose to:

- Lead take the initiative to put things right or initiate discussion
- Talk find out your partner's needs, worries and concerns, and how they feel •
- Apologise as soon as it's appropriate, and don't let your pride stop you!
- Forgive when needed, and as soon as possible, then let it go forever!
- Forget let go of any intention to repay or get back at your partner

What do you need to forgive or get forgiveness for now?

Final thoughts:

- Forgiveness is powerful for building trust, overcoming hurt and conflict, and renewing a relationship.
- When you stuff up, say sorry, and get forgiveness. The hardest part remains that's letting go of it. Work hard on that, because you won't be free until you do.

PARENTHOOD – SESSION 11

Model and Role of Parent (parenthood from God's design and purpose)

CONTEXT: Kairology Parenthood is the third part of the Kairology series, which follows Personhood and Marriage. We've recently completed Marriage – remember that the best partner makes the greatest parent! The Parenthood Module (5 sessions) looks at parenthood from a biblical perspective, and we look at why good parenthood (and parenthood) is essential to a healthy and joyful family, and for society. Out of this comes amazing fulfilment as a person, partner and father. It's the crowning glory for family life. We look at the purpose of parenthood, and the opportunity for you to rethink and re-establish your own views and actions towards parenthood and relationships with sons and daughters.

Five sessions

The five sessions are:

- 1. Model and Role of Parent
- 2. Connecting with children
- 3. Leading the family
- 4. Love, discipline and coaching
- 5. Renewing and maintaining parenthood

OBJECTIVES:

- Continuing commitment to the study
- Understanding God's intention and model of parenthood
- Understanding the purpose of parenthood
- Reviewing personal values and attitudes with children
- Looking to future possibility and personal change

What do I want to achieve from the parenthood module?

What is the purpose of parenthood?

The scriptural base for parenthood is hard to pinpoint – because it's the whole Bible! From start to end it's a story of parenthood. God has every joy, pleasure, frustration, emotion, challenge and fulfilment with His children – US! And the best of all that is love. He always seeks the best for us, and He never gives up on us. That is the example for us to follow.

God made parents to stand alongside, set us for the journey, guide, inspire, show faith, and most of all give us love we will always cherish.

Genesis 1:27-28 & 31 – The fruit of the covenant

²⁷ So God created man in his own likeness. He created him in the likeness of God. He created them as male and female.²⁸ God blessed them. He said to them, "Have children and increase your numbers. Fill the earth and bring it under your control. Rule over the fish in the waters and the birds of the air. Rule over every living creature that moves on the ground."²⁹ ³¹ God saw everything he had made. And it was very good.

Genesis 2:7

Then the Lord God formed a man. He made him out of the dust of the ground. He breathed the breath of life into him. And the man became a living person.

Remember from the *Marriage* module, the fifth purpose of marriage:

Fruitful: our success seen in one-another; jointly purposeful; productive; procreation

Remember from the *Personhood* module that God created us as spiritual as well as physical beings. Adam walked with God and they had a spiritual relationship. As we draw on that spiritual relationship, let's consider the results - *the fruit*.

Galatians 5:22

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

This represents the parenthood of God and His character. Is that the experience you had of parenthood? What would your parenthood be like with all that in place, and how would your children be? The greatest block that people have about their ability to be good parents are the blocks that may have been created in their own experience of parented.

Summarise your experience as a child – what are the key words that describe your experience of being parented?

You're not alone. We all have good and bad experiences of being parented. That's because none of us are perfect. Parenthood doesn't come with an instruction manual – except of course for God's example as a loving heavenly Father. You have the advantage of learning about that model – maybe your own father and mother didn't have this privilege, so you may need to recognise that, and forgive them.

Whatever your experience of parenthood was, what is the legacy you have inherited? What were the results of your experience? What are the wounds you may be carrying now, and bringing to your own children for their experience of parenthood?

Even if it's not your own parent, who do you regard as a good role model for parenthood? Who is it and what did they do?

What good and helpful values have others given to you?

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Some Simple Truths

A great parent:

- Loves God (knows the Heavenly Father)
- Loves their children's mother/father (creates a home of happiness and peace)
- Loves the children (sets standards)

He provides success through six S's:

- Shelter & sustenance
- Safety & security
- Social and community base
- Standards and boundaries
- Support emotionally
- Spiritual legacy

Parenthood is not buying a gift, it's being the gift!

This is the **power of example**! It's simple, and a formula for successful parenthood, but its hard work that we are seldom prepared for when we start out sowing the seeds. So, we have to be willing to learn. In demonstrating each aspect, we not only bring success to our role as a parent, but success to the next generation of parents (think about our river model). What an exciting responsibility! What a privilege!

A word about the VOID. Remember we talked about the void in *Personhood*. Think about what void there is for children when they have an absent father or mother.

Find a parental role-model for yourself NOW. Be a parent to your children NOW.

PARENTHOOD – SESSION 12

Connecting (being present and real)

Absence isn't just about being physically separated from the family. Being present and connected is a much bigger challenge, even if you were sitting at home! Look back at the River Model, which we looked at in the Marriage Module. Remind yourself about how children become an important part of the journey. It is *their journey* with you.

The added dimension: children

Relationship continues to be 3-way (vertical and horizontal). But now the bottom of the triangle is not just man and woman, but children. You all have a relationship with God, but you both need to lead the relationship for children and teach them. They learn from you how to have a relationship with Him, and with each other.

The Triangle:

- Communication is relationship (remember from *Personhood & Marriage*)
- Harmony
- Spiritual relationships



Connection Principles

- 1. Remind yourself of The River. Remember that in marriage this was an image of **joining and journey**. The same applies to children, except that where you both had a choice, they don't. They are born into your family for better or worse, richer or poorer, sickness and health. So they are to be loved and cherished as God's gift and blessing. This is your responsibility and duty, whatever background and experience you came from. This is a new river. When a new child joins the family, it will never be the same everyone has to adjust and give.
- 2. Your family relies on your marriage. Your children's wellbeing relies on the strength of your **partnership as a couple**. So your relationship must always be paramount it must be nurtured, be strong and grow, otherwise how can you be what children need?
- 3. Be clear about your **joint approach** to parenthood. Be in agreement about your basic values, approaches and philosophies. This is essential for consistency and harmony in the family. Be consistent together, and fair & consistent with each child.

How do you connect successfully with your children now?

Who are the orphans?

- Those without an accepting, active and connected parent.
- Those without the kind of father or mother that God intended.

What creates a great home for a family?

- Parents who love and care, and who are there.
- One where the responsibility has not been delegated (or abdicated) to extended family, school, church or day-care/kindergarten.

Remember in *Marriage* we looked at communication (verbal and non-verbal). Think about how you listen to your children, and how you communicate with them. Remember communication is relationship! Some special things to remember with children are:

- They don't necessarily see things as you see them
- They need building up, not putting down
- They copy, so they learn everything from role models, especially boys from dad, girls from mum
- They seek cues and signals from you, so give them and make sure they are clear
- They need you and your time, that's what's most precious
- They need to share heaps of information and feelings be ready to listen and take interest
- They need to see a parent as being fair, tender and loving
- They are part of you; you are part of their identity so let them discover who you are and what you stand for
- They get a dose of natural hormones that you need to help them manage

Boys and girls are different, so take that into account in your approach and communication. Some typical differences or tendencies might be:

²⁵ "The older son was in the field. When he came near the house, he heard music and dancing. ²⁶ So he called one of the servants. He asked him what was going on.

²⁷ "Your brother has come home,' the servant replied. 'Your father has killed the fattest calf. He has done this because your brother is back safe and sound.'

²⁸ "The older brother became angry. He refused to go in. So his father went out and begged him.

²⁹ "But he answered his father, 'Look! All these years I've worked like a slave for you. I have always obeyed your orders. You never gave me even a young goat so I could celebrate with my friends. ³⁰ But this son of yours wasted your money with some prostitutes. Now he comes home. And for him you kill the fattest calf!' ³¹ "'My son,' the father said, 'you are always with me. Everything I have is yours. ³² But we had to celebrate and be glad. This brother of yours was dead. And now he is alive again. He was lost. And now he is found.'"

PARENTHOOD – SESSION 13

Leading the Family (you and your household)

In previous sessions we looked at 'being present', as part of connecting with your family. Let's look at it again...

A few keys points:

- You choose your way of being and behaving with others
- Leading your family requires you to be proactive, not aggressive or passive
- Proactiveness makes you a positive, confident, purposeful and loving parent
- It serves you and your family
- It provides the stability and the role model your family needs

Think of some examples of how you can be proactive as a parent

Leadership

There are a few simple leadership principles that apply to any situation, including the family.

- Leadership is about navigating a journey for yourself and others
- To know your intended journey, your need to plan it with your partner
- The journey has a purpose; otherwise nobody knows why they are on it.
- Leadership begins with being able to lead yourself effectively so that you can them lead others effectively
- Good leadership requires a good example and a good role model

A team is defined as a group working together; in ancient times literally a group of oxen yoked or bound together so that they work effectively and go in the same direction. Interestingly they worked more effectively if they were from the same herd (or family). Consider what binds you together as a family, and also what puts that at risk. Remember the *House of Being*, and what might beat against your house.

Your job as a spouse and parent is to sense the dangers and take action! We have some big issues in society that result from delinquent (neglectful/offensive) parents and un-parented children. Everyone is called to lead their family and to take full responsibility.

Don't beat yourself up on all this, but be honest and face up to who you are. We all fail and we all fall short. What's important is recognising this, and doing something about it.

What are the most important changes you will make now, based on what you've found?

From the model *Our Purpose as People* remember that we are called to give and serve, not to be demanding and getting. Think about this again with regard to loving children. They love us as parents, unconditionally, but it is in giving love to them that we receive it all the more.

Remember that the family key is this: love is about putting others first, about being sacrificial, and about serving. This is for many of us opposite to our nature. Love is powerful – it overcomes anger and brings us into perspective.

PARENTHOOD – SESSION 14

Love, Discipline and Coaching (balance and communication)

Love is the context for discipline. What are the key things that came from your review of love in the family in session 13? 121

We all have a different experience of love and discipline (training) in the family. Some experience discipline positively in a way that builds them up; others have only the experience of cruelty that had the mask of discipline. It wasn't discipline and didn't come from love, and may have been abuse. There are no perfect ways of discipline because we are all different, with different backgrounds, personalities and needs. In coming together as a couple we have two different experiences, which need careful matching and agreement if we are going to be effective and consistent in parenthood. Let's look at some basics.

Boundaries

We all need them. Rules and laws define a boundary. They are there for agreement, for standards, for understanding, and for good order. They are intended to give clarity and protection for the good of a family, a team, an organisation or a society. As a family unit, everyone needs to have clear boundaries, and the consequences of what happens if we overstep them. The Bible is God's Word (the maker's handbook), and is a key source of laws and boundaries. Many have been written into national laws. For a family, we take the lead from the society we live in, and we have our own boundaries within the family. They define right and wrong, what is acceptable and what isn't. They are meant for the good of everyone.

Discipline

This comes from the Latin word for *instruction*. It means a teaching, training, code or pattern. So discipline is about bringing into (or back into) understanding and order, helping us form good habits. That's how Jesus created his *disciples*. So with children, we decide what our teaching and standards will be, give them instruction, and keep them in order. As with leadership, we need to provide an example and role model through self-discipline. The key thing here is to know that discipline is a positive learning, not a negative punishment.

Punishment and Correction

Either or both of these are applied as a result over-stepping a boundary. Punishment can be loss or withdrawal of privilege or an action that serves as a penance. Correction is about educating, guiding and coaching into a different way of behaviour or compliance. The use and misuse of physical and mental punishment is destructive, ineffective and ruins relationships. It does not come from love, or a desire to build a responsible child, teenager or adult. And often it breaks the law!

As parents we need to ensure that correction is done in a loving manner, using good communication that both of these define and build our relationships. Discipline is linked to love because we want the best for those we love – we want them to be on a path of learning, building and growing. Communication is important because children need:

- Reminding of boundaries •
- Warning of consequences
- Explanation of what happened
- Understanding of next steps

Remember the use of verbal and non-verbal communication from Marriage. Children need a clear and consistent message, from our words, tone, stance and actions. We need to be consistent with the individual child, and consistent in how we treat all children.

What I've learnt from this so far is:

Here are 10 simple principles for communication in parenthood:

- 1. Love them; show affection
- 2. Listen; find out their feelings observe and ask
- 3. Help them know your thinking, and get their understanding and agreement
- 4. Affirm them praise and build confidence
- 5. Praise generously, criticise rarely (Proverbs 31:28-29)
- 6. Teach giving mutual rather than self-fulfilment
- 7. Take an interest in their interests; invest time and do things together
- 8. Find their needs and seek to meet them
- 9. Forgive them and apologise when you need to!
- 10. Support them

Dealing with conflict – some principles:

- 1. Don't let it stew deal with it and move on
- 2. Don't create the conflict don't exasperate, humiliate or anger children
- 3. Let go when appropriate (cut some slack!)
- 4. Give children support and respect
- 5. Making boundaries clear and consistent
- 6. Recognise their hurt and help them overcome it
- 7. No blame, no right and wrong, stick to facts
- 8. Be firm and fair
- 9. Admit if you're mistaken
- 10. Find out how they feel
- 11. Be personal: say "I feel that" not "You always/never"
- 12. Build harmony (with the child, and for the family)
- 13. Be their hero help them win and learn from what goes wrong
- 14. Be proactive with children, rather than passive or aggressive

What does God say?

Ephesians 6:4 *Fathers, don't make your children angry. Instead, train them and teach them the ways of the Lord as you raise them.*

Coaching

Another way to look at children and discipline is to look at it from a coaching perspective. Coaching means to transport from one place to another, to get from A to B. Think about what each of your children needs to grow and learn so that they can have a great life. How would you guide and coach them to get from A to B, like a sports coach might coach someone in passing a ball, in a swimming stroke, or a running technique. Help them to visualise having success or overcoming a problem. The simplest coaching model is: Reality \rightarrow Goal \rightarrow Choice \rightarrow Habit

Use it for yourself; use it to coach your kids. Make the end goal worthwhile, get the enthusiasm, and give encouragement and praise.

WORDS TO HELP THINKING

As parents, as creations of the Father God himself, we should seek to live His example of the balance between love and discipline. They are two sides of the same coin. We all need correction and grace.

Instead, you take delight in showing your faithful love to them.¹⁹Once again you will show loving concern for us. You will completely wipe out the evil things we've done. You will throw all of our sins into the bottom of the sea.

John 14:30-31 ³⁰ "I will not speak with you much longer. The prince of this world is coming. He has no power over me. ³¹ But the world must learn that I love the Father. They must also learn that I do exactly what my Father has commanded me to do."

with hard times. God uses them to train you. He is treating you as children. What children are not trained by their parents? ^a God trains all of his children. But what if he doesn't train you? Then you are like children of people who weren't married to each other. You are not truly God's children.^a Besides, we have all had human parents who trained us. We respected them for it. How much more should we be trained by the Father of our spirits and live!^a Our parents trained us for a little while. They did what they thought was best. But God trains us for our good. He wants us to share in his holiness.^a No training seems pleasant at the time. In fact, it seems painful. But later on it produces a harvest of godliness and peace. It does that for those who have been trained by it.

1 John 4:15-18 ¹⁵ God lives in anyone who agrees that Jesus is the Son of God. That kind of person remains joined to God. ¹⁶ So we know that God loves us. We depend on it. God is love. Anyone who leads a life of love shows that he is joined to God. And God is joined to him.¹⁷ So love is made complete among us. We will be bold on the day God judges us. That's because in this world we love as Jesus did.¹⁸ There is no fear in love. Instead, perfect love drives fear away. Fear has to do with being punished. The one who fears does not have perfect love.

A THOUGHT

Corrie Ten Boom spent time in Nazi prisons and concentration camps. She was able to forgive her oppressors. She wrote and spoke about forgiveness of others, and especially a guard she later met after the war. On speaking about forgiveness, she spoke about being forgiven by God. She wrote "When I confessed them to the Father, Jesus Christ washed them in His blood. They are now cast in the deepest sea and a sign is put up that says, NO FISHING ALLOWED." So let's ensure that we forgive others, and never go fishing!

PARENTHOOD – SESSION 15

Renewing Parenthood (role modelling and putting things right)

We all have a different experience and view of parenthood. For some of us it is a mystery, because we may not have had a good experience, or good role models ourselves. You may have lived in situations where you experienced poor examples of parenthood, and weak role models – maybe grandparents, parents, or perhaps it's more about your personal struggle in being a parent. Alternatively, your experience and background may have provided great examples of parenthood, which you struggle to match up to.

That's why we need to do two things:

- 1. Build a parenthood approach with our spouse, getting ideas, agreement and consistency.
- Find and talk to other parents you trust we need each-other! It may be your parent, sibling, cousin or friend who is a great parent. It may be a pastor, chaplain, social worker or other professional who can give you tips and advice. And don't forget there are heaps of books on parenting.

Whatever your experience, you can only improve on it – if that's what you really want. So you have to make the choices and decisions, and you have to be the person willing to take on loving leadership in your family – whether this is now or in the future. It's never too late for a new start.

Review the Marriage module, and especially what is there in relation to boundaries and forgiveness. Especially think about:

- Lead take the initiative to put things right or initiate discussion
- Talk find out needs, worries and concerns, and how the child feels
- Apologise when it's appropriate, and don't let your pride stop you!
- Forgive when needed, and as soon as possible, then let it go forever!
- Forget let go of any intention to repay or get back at your child

PARENTHOOD MODULE CONCLUSION

Parenthood is a matter of biology in the least. And at most it is a matter of choice, love, commitment, care, devotion, nurture, psychology, selflessness, leadership, resourcefulness, and a heap of other things. The choice is yours. The bottom line is that the more you put into relationship the more you get from it. Parenthood is a vast, long term investment in another human being.

Our own bad experience and shortcomings are no basis for denying a future for our own children. Someone has to break a bad cycle, so it may as well be you. Their potential is your responsibility.
