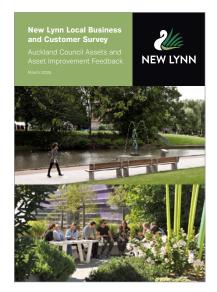

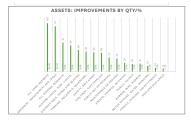




#### Stakeholder Survey



Tracy Mulholland on behalf of the New Lynn Business Association submitted a 3 year New Lynn town centre investment and beautification proposed action plan. It is the role of the NLBA to lobby for town centre improvements. A survey of a wide cross section of the New Lynn community was done to ascertain opinions as to what the New Lynn community would like improved. Over 600 pieces of information were gathered and analysed, resulting in the Stakeholder Survey that was submitted to Auckland Council and will ultimately benefit our community with substantial investment in various projects.

The NLBA committee and management team work tirelessly throughout the year. The work they do covers significant financial planning and summaries including preparation of the auditors and accounting reports required to be presented at the AGM. Each month a summary of the financial position is prepared together with a formal Managers report and presented to the Executive Committee for comment and approval. All work related to the Auckland Council Business Improvement District Policy is prepared in line with agreement terms and presented for approval.

NLBA is involved in lobbying on behalf of the members for improvements within the area and are well connected to do this. Fundraising is also a big part of the NLBA work, over this period this included \$3,500 for Christmas events, \$15,000 for CCTV, \$5,700 for town centre beautification and \$5,700 for fundraising for the NLBA/Auckland Council Business Customer Survey Report.

All events and promotional activities are executed with a strong focus on budget management, ensuring cost-effectiveness while maximising community engagement. The primary goal is to attract visitors and increase foot traffic within the area, contributing to both vibrancy and economic vitality. Each initiative is aligned with strategic goals and tailored to reflect the unique character of the district.

The management team acknowledge the significant amount of work that has been completed this year. We thank the voluntary committee for the contribution and work and acknowledge the Whau Local Board representative.

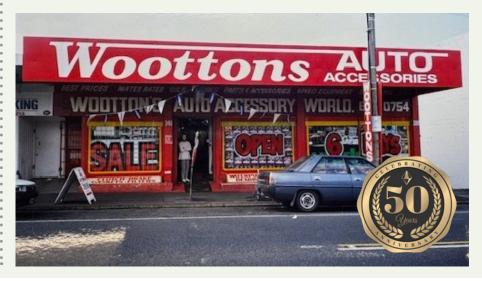
We're not just a retail store—we run a specialist workshop on-site, with experienced staff who service motor scooters, small quads, and pit bikes. We stock a wide range of parts and
