



Committee Update

2025! What a great year this is going to be! The team are closely watching the upcoming Reserve Bank OCR statement on the 19th February 2025, it will be interesting to see if there will be a .25% or .5% cut - let's hope for the best. The consumer price index (CPI) website which was updated 22 January 2025 and the next update being 17 April 2025 shows the annual change is +2.2% annual percentage change December 2020 - December 2024 quarters and. whilst we have this scenario at play, an internet search is showing the inflation outlook has been revised lower for both 2025 and 2026, with forecasts pointing to an annual CPI inflation of 2.3 percent by March 2025 and staying near the 2 percent inflation target mid-point in the subsequent years. What may also interest our readers is, The food price index (FPI) which measures the changes in prices that households pay for food.

Stats NZ measure the price change by tracking the prices of individual food items that make up a representative food basket.

The FPI basket is organised into five subgroups:

- fruit and vegetables
- meat, poultry, and fish
- · grocery food
- non-alcoholic beverages
- restaurant meals and ready-to-eat food.

The food group is the only group of the CPI for which Stats NZ prepare an index each month. The great news for our community and consumers is that the New Lynn Business Association is doing something about supporting customers to get value when dining out in our local community! We have developed a Fabulous Food Booklet, it's similar to Grab-A-Deal, the very popular New Lynn Business Association free

booklet of giveaways and discounts in the town centre BID area. Check out the new booklet that is developed for you, our customers. We love New Lynn, the Association supports local business and here is a way of giving back to the community and our membership.

In this newsletter, you will also see our team have busy in the area, supporting local projects and activities. We acknowledge the near completion of the pedestrian crossing on Veronica Street, this project started some 6 years ago at the suggestion of Lisa Truttman, Historian and a great community leader. Whilst this project has taken a long-time, we have this safety measure in place and, to you, the ratepayer and resident – thank you, your rates are being spent on this great local project.
