EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE UPDATE

The NLBA executive are volunteers who are nominated on an annual basis to represent local business and their customers views to the appropriate decision making bodies. The NLBA advocates for betterment alongside our aim of 'Promoting New Lynn as a destination for shopping, work and living'.

Auckland Council and NLBA executive aim to develop New Lynn into a Metropolitan Centre. New Lynn is an area that hosts an Integrated Transport Centre, new housing developments and is progressing the goal of being a Metropolitan Centre. We have, as a business and community, had our share of challenges. Some of those recent challenges have been: traffic, changes to the 2010-2030 New Lynn Urban Plan, flooding and issues related to homelessness, rough sleeping and begging.

Recently, we worked with the TTCFL, the Whau Local Board and our manager to install additional CCTV's as this is an area of concern to members. \$25,000 has been spent recently on this project and we are pleased to say we are seeing the benefits of the project. CCTV's can also be helpful in an emergency, such as the recent New Lynn flooding, if located in the area as they can be used to identify and observe emergency situations.

To end, last week we had the unfortunate situation of a sinkhole opening in New Lynn in the area of the flooding. Barry Potter, Auckland council's director of environmental and infrastructure, said the sinkhole was discovered by contractors on the evening of May 4th near to the damaged footpath on Great North Road. The team were immediately working on managing the issue and communicated the situation. One part of the road was closed and has now had an interim remedy. The working party will be discussing this matter following an urgent meeting. More information and communications will follow. The NLBA website is being updated with new information.

As a follow up on last month's flooding meeting for the New Lynn business community, we are pleased to share with you that the working party that was announced on the night will be soon meeting. HOMELESSNESS AND BEGGARS

The NLBA has received complaints regarding issues related to some of the beggars that have been coming into the town centre. We have also received some feedback and complaints regarding the homeless people who have been sleeping by the community centre. The people who are known to Police and have been 'sleeping, using' the area by the community centre/by the rail bridge and the Chinese Garden have been lingering in the area and in some cases are causing some level of concern to the public and the business community. Whilst the NLBA has a full understanding of the current housing crisis, the situation of homelessness in the City (evident in the Auckland Council governing body committee reports), the concerns related to the behaviour, the dog (owned by one homeless person) and the intimidation, behaviour of the begging is at a point where further discussions and some solutions need to be found. We ask you to share with the NLBA any concerns you have. The NLBA will be approaching the Whau Local Board and Auckland Council to try to work through some solutions. We will keep you informed however, in the first instance if there are issues of real concern please contact the New Lynn Police station or if it is out of their opening hours, the Henderson Police station. The New Lynn Policing team are aware of these issues and working with us and the community to also seek some resolution.
