• Junior World Orienteering Champs trials

Trials to be selected to represent at the Junior World Orienteering Champs have started with the first weekend on 18-19th March in Christchurch and the second weekend at the sprint and multi-day distance races over Easter weekend in the Manawatu. The multi-day distance races will also be trials for the World Orienteering Champs team. We wish all the best to the club members trialling Zefa Fa'avae, Tide Fa'avae, Riley Croxford, Eddie Swain for JWOC and Matt Ogden for WOC.

Stand-out performances at the Christchurch trials were:

- Zefa with a massive win in the Middle Distance at Butlers Bush, plus a second placings at the Sprint at Hillmorton High and also at the Long Distance at Laidmore Forest;
- Tide Fa'avae gained a 5th in the Middle and 7th in the Sprint. She recovered well from a bad first control in the Long Distance to finish 9th;
- Riley Croxford put in a solid effort with a 3rd in the Middle and 4th placings in both the Sprint and Long meaning he's well placed for selection;
- Eddie Swain finished 6th in the Long and 7th in the Middle after a 40 second error near the end of the Sprint meant he dropped from 6th to 13th.

All four are in contention for selection and represent us well! We're proud of them!

Competition is strong for the six men and six women to represent New Zealand in the 20 and under competition in Romania in July. Both the men's and women's fields had around 18 athletes running with places in the team hotly contested.
