# **MAITAI**

# **SUNDAY 16TH AUGUST**

Start times: 10.30 am to 1pm - Courses Close: 2pm

The start/finish is at the same place as last year; at the covered BBQ area at Black Hole in Branford Park. To get there you travel up the Maitai Valley until you see the signs. Plenty of car parking. Toilets and a play ground are nearby.

Courses offered will be:

Long Red

Short Red

Orange

Yellow

White

Picture

String

The map is now a Colour map incorporating the old Botanics and Maitai maps and also a new bit of intricate farmland. The scale for the Red courses will be 1:10000 and the other courses will be at a slightly larger scale. All maps have a 10m contour interval. All courses will be run on colour maps except the White and Picture. The Red courses map will not have fences, power lines or poles marked. Symbolic control descriptions will be used on the Red courses. On the Orange you will get both written and symbolic control descriptions. All other courses will only have written. All controls will be flagged. The area is steep and the long courses are both mentally and physically challenging and not for the faint hearted.

Being close to town this would be a great area to introduce a friend or two. The varying terrain means this area is very suitable for beginners and experienced members alike. This map now has to be one of our clubs best maps and will hopefully make up for the demise of Ngawhatu. Bring a compass. Gaiters or leg protection is strongly advised for most courses. Please respect private property, out of bounds areas and stock.

### INTERNATIONAL CONTROL DESCRIPTIONS

Pages 6 and 7 give the International Control Descriptions as published in NZ Orienteering in December 1994. This is the centre page so you can remove it for your reference. I am sure most of us will find a refresher or maybe even a serious study session could well paid dividends in completion of up coming courses. Note that the planner for Maitai has taken fences, powerlines and poles off the Red course maps so other features will need closer study!

The whisper is that Peter Syms has been housebound due to recent high rainfall and has been plotting a difference approach for the Karanga event. The Eves Valley map has been updated by Ian Blackman as no doubt he has found some interesting control sites for the September event.

### **CLASSES FOR ORIENTEERING**

The following is taken from Appendix B of "Orienteering – A way of learning outdoor navigation" by Peter Wilson. No excuse for incomplete control cards now.

"Competitors, for Orienteering, are divided into the following classes by sex and age. The change from one age class to the next takes place at the beginning of the calender year in which the competitor reaches the new age group.



# **CONTROLLERS COMMENT**

I have controlled four events at Tahunanui and each time the weather has been perfect. We have always had the start at the tennis pavilion on the theory that it would provide good shelter in the event of rain. This theory has never been tested. The year someone dares to start elsewhere no doubt it will pour!

The day was so glorious that I soon forgot my grumpiness at having to get up in the dark on a Sunday morning, and traipsing round at 8am putting out controls was almost pleasurable! However much time you allow to set up, it never seems to be enough, so thanks to those who so willingly offered their help during the 10am scramble. We were unfortunate that one of our helpers didn't turn up and it was a lesson to the organisers to telephone the day before the event just to make sure helpers are coming. The ever-cheerful Tim Stringer stepped in, as well as doing most of the unpacking and packing up of the trailer. Thanks, Tim.

Amazingly, no controls went missing during the day, although almost as soon as we had started, one found its way into the upper branches of a tree - no one complained of having been adversely affected. Apart from a few broken clippers, the day was relatively incident-free as far as the organisers were concerned.

The String course looked great with its animals at each control - thanks to Hans and Yvonne. What a shame more youngsters did not take advantage of it. Are our younger members getting too old for this sort of thing or did some of them get distracted by the Picture course?

It must have been a record turnout for the Red course with 22 attempting it ...and only one DNF - which was by our Christchurch visitors, probably the most experienced orienteers amongst the lot of us! No doubt local knowledge helped since most had been on the map before and Hans positively blitzed around with Peter just behind. It was nice to get quite a few positive comments from people who were surprised at how much they could still enjoy the map despite its familiarity.

Considerable clearing work had been done by the Council even since our last check on control sites. However, no actual control sites were affected except for one tree which had completely disappeared complete with the pink wool marking the site. A substitute tree was hastily found on the morning. Whoever runs this event next year will need to do a few map corrections first.

All other courses were successfully completed by most and no other DNFs indicated a good day was had by all. Lots of new people this will be your first newsletter. We hope to see you all again.


