



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Tēnā koutou Katoa,

It's my privilege to present my second President's Report, reflecting on a year of both challenge and progress—a year that has demanded adaptability, innovation, and resilience from all of us.

Over the past 12 months, we've seen our region face significant environmental events, including the recent floods that disrupted businesses, homes, and lives. At the same time, the rapid evolution of technology—particularly the rise of Al-is reshaping how we work. For those businesses not yet embracing these shifts, the risk of being left behind is real. Yet amidst all this change, I am proud to say that the Chamber, alongside many of you, is rising to the challenge and continuing to support our members with energy and intent.

Financial Overview

For the financial year ending 31 March 2025, we are reporting a loss of \$30,000. This outcome does not reflect a lack of effort or value delivered —it reflects the real challenges many organisations are facing right now.

Despite this, I remain optimistic. We continue to maintain financial reserves in line with our policy, ensuring at least six months of operating expenses are secured. We've also invested in initiatives like the Chamber Monopoly, which we expect to sell out before Christmas (a great gift idea talk to our team!).

While we saw the conclusion of our Creative Careers programme, our focus on delivery and impact remains strong through PrimeTime, Strong Community, and Start-Up support.

This year, we've also delivered a wide range of events and initiatives to bring value to your business, including:

For The Year Ended 31 March 2025

Reporting Entity

Nelson Tasman Regional Chamber of Commerce (Inc) is a society incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

Nelson Tasman Regional Chamber of Commerce (Inc) is a business helping in the Nelson Tasman region to strengthen and grow by expanding networks, building relationships and providing advocacy.

The special purpose financial report was authorised for issue by the Trustees on the date stated on the Statement of Financial Position.

Basis of Preparation

These financial statements are special purpose and have been prepared for the entity's management and its' members.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the entity and revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of consideration received. Revenue is accounted for as follows:

Subscriptions received is recognised at the beginning of the 12 month period to which the subscription relates. Income from Sponsorship is recognised at the time that the income is received. Where sponsorship is provided for contra-services, the sponsorship income is recognised when the contra-service is provided to the Chamber. Service Contract income - Income is recognised when the contract work is being undertaken and delivered. Interest Income is recognised on an accruals basis.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost, less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure directly attributable to the acquisition of assets, and includes the cost of replacements that are eligible for capitalisation when these are incurred.

Depreciation

Depreciation is charged to the Statement of Financial Performance at the same rates as are allowed by the Income Tax Act 2007 over the estimated useful lives of each item of property, plant and equipment.

The method and rates applied are as follows:

Asset ClassMethodRatePlant & EquipmentPrime Cost and Diminishing Value10.0 - 100.0%

Income Tax

The Nelson Tasman Chamber of Commerce Incorporated qualifies as an Association that is established mainly to develop the Nelson Tasman region to attract people, tourists, trade and visitors and none of the funds are used, or are available to be used, for any purpose that is not a charitable purpose, pursuant to the income tax exemption in section CW40 of the Income Tax Act 2007. Inland Revenue has previously confirmed the application of the exemption to the Association. Accordingly, no provision for income tax has been made.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are recorded at expected realisable value as determined by the Society.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

All revenue and expense transactions are recorded net of GST. Where applicable, all assets and liabilities have been stated net of GST with the exception of receivables and payables which are stated inclusive of GST. The NBS sponsorship in accounts receivable is recorded net of GST.

Inventory

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost, determined on a first-in-first-out basis, and net realisable value.

Investments

Bank Deposits are recorded at cost and interest has been accrued to balance date.

Audited Financial Statements

These Financial Statements have been subject to audit, please refer to the Auditors Report.

Term Deposits

Term Deposits are treated as Non-Current assets where it is management's intention to reinvest these at maturity.

Employee Costs

Employee entitlements are measured at undiscounted nominal values based on accrued entitlements at current rates of pay. This includes salaries and wages accrued up to balance date, annual leave earned but not taken at balance date and long service leave.

The board recognised a liability and an expense for bonuses it is contractually obliged to pay, or where a past event has created a constructive obligation.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous period.

3 Related Parties

Blueberry IT is a communications sponsor of the Chamber, and service provide as BBIT is the Chambers IT service provider.

Manoli Aerakis, Chamber Board Vice President is a Director of Go Accounting Limited. On behalf of Go Accounting Limited, Manoli delivers accounting and business training programmes promoted by the Chamber.

Findex (NZ) Ltd provide accounting services to the Chamber as part of the sponsorship of the Chamber Business after Five events.

There is a significant number (>25) of sponsors confirmed for that project which includes the following related parties:

- Go Accounting Limited, of which Board member Manoli Aerakis is a Director.
- The Advisory Board, of which Board member Alfredo Puche is a Director.
- The Free House, of which CEO Ali Boswijk is a co-owner.

Go Accounting Limited provides bookkeeping services to the Chamber.

5 Cleaning, Rent & Rates

Cleaning, Rent and Rates expenses have had recoveries set against them, so are shown as a net figure.

6 Reserves

Reserves of \$50 is made up from a gain on sale of General Office Equipment of \$31 in the 2004 year and a gain on sale of Shelving of \$19 in the 2008 year.
