process. Take nothing for granted, prepare well and come back safe.

A few pictures of the clean-up at the range in terms of fallen trees highlights the ongoing nature of maintenance and repairs at Packers Creek and the Murchison Range. We are hugely indebted to the few who do the bulk of the ongoing work there, Graeme S, Carina and Greg – mowing, spraying, trapping and clearing and more. Our ranges are not a self-cleaning oven (and I am not sure they really worked either!) – they require ongoing maintenance work. Soon there will be another working bee to sort out the mud, damage and other issues at Packers Creek so please make yourself available to help if at all possible.

When the full impact of the new Range Regulations become felt we will find that there are far fewer ranges in the country and possibly in our region. Packers Creek is a top level range (and Murchison also a very good range), it is absolutely worth maintaining and managing them to the best of our ability.

We are getting some requests from members wishing to become range officers, this is most welcome and we will be seeking to arrange a course after the roar. If you are also keen please contact Carina Jackson in the first instance and she will log your interest. We will need more Duty Officers for our roster when the new regulations go live in June.

Roar News – Helpful Info from GAC and MSC



Hunter Safety

The Game Animal Council encourages hunters to get out there and enjoy the fantastic hunting opportunities New Zealand has to offer. However, taking the necessary precautions is absolutely critical to having a safe and successful trip. Here are some basic hunting safety tips:



PREPARE

- 1. Plan where you are going to hunt and how long you will be out for.
- 2. Before you go, keep an eye on the weather forecast particularly for any rain and snow that could lead to a rise in river levels and make your plans accordingly.
- 3. Make sure everyone has the right clothing, food and equipment for all possible conditions.
- 4. Take into account the experience and fitness of everyone in your party when planning your trip.
- 5. Carry an emergency communication device such as a distress beacon or satellite phone.
- 6. Make sure you have a hard copy 1:50,000 topographical map (and compass) to supplement any mapping apps you may use on your phone.
- 7. Check the long range weather forecast and plan your trip accordingly. DOC have recently formed a partnership with NIWA and have developed a new weather forecasting tool, that may be of use to many hunters. **You can access it here**.
- 8. Leave your intentions, including where you are going and when you plan to get out, with a reliable contact.
- 9. Give your gear (including your first aid kit) a thorough check and repair/replace anything that needs it.

MAKE GOOD DECISIONS

- 1. Involve your whole party in the decision-making and making sure everyone is comfortable with the plans being made.
- 2. Take firearm safety seriously, because even if you are hunting alone it is highly likely that other hunters will be around.
- 3. Positively identify your target. It is not good enough to 'think' what you are looking at it is a big stag, you need to 'know' it is.
- 4. Treat every firearm as loaded and if you are sharing a firearm, make sure the person carrying the firearm maintains responsibility for checking it is in the appropriate state of load.
- 5. If you are bush hunting it is a good idea for everyone in the party to wear blaze.
- 6. Respect the dynamic environment you are hunting in. Weather can change quickly and river levels can rise fast. Be prepared to wait out a swollen river or storm system.
- 7. Be respectful of other hunting parties and other backcountry users and share the landscape appropriately.

NZ Red Stag Ageing Guide

The Game Animal Council has developed this simple guide to provide hunters with information on how to judge the age of red deer stags in the field and positively contribute to their management. Click on the cover image to open and download:



Red deer are the most abundant and widespread deer species in New Zealand and can be found in most regions of both the North and South Islands. Red deer are also the game animal species that Kiwis hunt most often.

Good red deer management in New Zealand is about hunters targeting old mature stags as well as harvesting their fair share of breeding-age hinds (to help achieve a high-quality, low-density population and hunting resource). Harvesting younger stags does nothing for herd management and means those animals never get the chance to mature and realise their full potential.

Fish and Game News

NELSON MARLBOROUGH FISH & GAME REPORT



PARADISE SHELDUCK TREND COUNTS COMPLETED: Staff have completed annual 'parrie' counts across the region. Most count sites are undertaken using fixed wing plane, a big day in the air with plenty of ground to cover. A number of sites are also completed on foot, using binoculars as an aid where pictures of the ponds are taken and images analysed on a computer in order to get an accurate count. Swan counts were also completed at the same time, with numbers of swans at an all time high in the region. Swan numbers were also very high in other central Fish & game regions, so it appears there has been very good breeding conditions in the past year.

NEW ACCESS TRACK FOR LOWER MOTUEKA RIVER: A new fishing access track has been made for the lower Motueka River at Rocky River. The new access track replaces a nearby existing entry point which has become problematic with illegal campers and other undesirable activities.

GREAT COUNT FOR WANGAPEKA: The Wangapeka River was recently drift dived and had a great count at both sites. In particular, the lower site near the Motueka confluence had a record count, with 159 large brown trout and 165 medium trout over a 1km stretch. We have had reports of some great fishing from the Wangapeka this season, which has been one of the form rivers for the region over the past few years.

CROP DEPREDATION PERMITS: Staff have been issuing a number of permits to farmers to control parries, post moult.


