Two places really matter at the range...the area one shoots from and the stops that ensure your projectiles are safely prevented from going further than necessary. These stops need to be regularly maintained and rebuilt (with recycled glass) to ensure the range and surrounds are safe.



The finished product – 100 metre stop with fresh recycled glass in place to absorb the next lot of projectiles.

Many thanks to the members that showed up for the Packers Creek Range working bee: Mike, Craig, Murray, Nathan, Rob, Ross, Ian, Mark and Greg.

As they say many hands (and a digger!!) make light work and we had it all easily done inside 2 hours with some staying on to sight rifles in for upcoming hunting trips after that.

We got the pig damage turned over and resettled to ensure mowing is not a nightmare, the 100 metre mound built back up & the glass pile tidied up for future use.

# Looking Back on Winter Hunts




It was so cold here that the legs of meat froze solid overnight on the verandah.




Leave only footprints (and frostbitten toenails.....)


Enter, the latest Nelson Branch Newsletter.

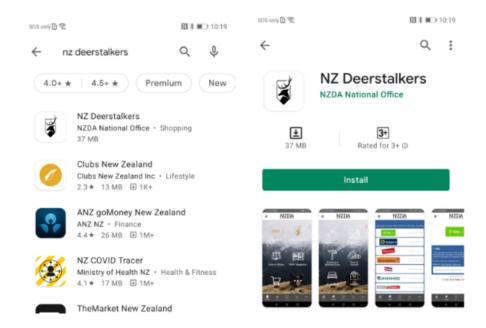



#### Fish and Game News

#### NELSON MARLBOROUGH FISH & GAME REPORT



- NEW FISHING SEASON COMMENCES: The trout fishing season commenced and fishing has been better than expected
  in some areas. After te massive July flood, hopes were not high leading into the season, however angler reports suggest
  there are OK numbers of fish around, and the condition of these fish is fairly good.
- WAIMEA PARK ADULT FISHERY POPULAR: The new family/adult pond at Waimea Park is proving to be a hit, with
  plenty of anglers using the facility on a regular basis. We have undertaken two releases there s far this season, so there
  have been plenty of fish available. Pink softbaits have proven to be deadly, and for the fly angler a sunken woolly bugger
  to put the fly in the zone has been working well, made easier if used with an intermediate or sinking fly line.
- WETLAND CREATION: Staff have been undertaking multiple site visits for future wetlands, most of these are on private land and will become duck breeding areas in the future.
- UPLAND GAME HUNTING ONEFORTYONE(OFO) FORESTS: Staff are in the process of negotiating access to large
  areas of OFO forest estate for upland game hunting in time for next season. Currently, access to these forests does exist,
  however it is up to the individual to apply and pay an annual fee for the access a reasonably cumbersome process and
  one not generally taken up by bird hunters. If all goes to plan, we expect there to be free access for up to 30 hunters for
  one weekend per month to hunt the 'General Access' areas in Golden Downs, North Bank Wairau and
  Rai/Pelorus/Wangamoas.
