





Whio Numbers Flying High in Kahurangi

The whio population in Kahurangi National Park has had an increase of 340% since 2000.

A Department of Conservation (DOC) survey into the whio population in Kahurangi National Park has seen a massive increase and DOC are saying it is thanks to the combined efforts of the community, businesses and a captive breeding facility.

The survey, which started in 2020 and is ongoing, has to date found an increase of 340% in whio (blue duck) numbers since 1998-2000 when DOC last surveyed the bird.

Currently, there are 846 adult whio in Kahurangi with 335 breeding pairs among them.

This is an increase from the 2000s survey which recorded only 191 whio and 58 breeding pairs in the park.

DOC science technician Jason Malhan said the "combined endeavours" of DOC, the community, businesses and a captive breeding facility have "greatly improved the fortunes of whio" in the park.

After the last survey, DOC started two security sites in the early 2000s to protect whio with stout trapping and boosting breeding techniques to fast-track population growth.

"The Ōpārara-Ugly and Wangapeka-Fyfe Whio Security sites have both surpassed the goal of 50 breeding pairs," Malham said.

Support from businesses like Genesis, through their Whio Forever programme, the Issac Conservation and Wildlife Trust in raising whio ducklings, as well as contractor and community help in maintaining traps, has been "instrumental" in increasing numbers.

DOC staff have walked 700km of the waterways in Kahurangi so far and have been "encouraged" by the whio increases.

Other volunteers include Tapawera Area School students and community groups Friends of Flora, the Friends of Cobb and the Mokihinui-Lyell Trust.

These volunteers help to lay traps in catchment areas like Cobb Valley, the Flora Stream catchment and Old Ghost Road.

There was also an Air New Zealand supported biodiversity project in Gouland Downs setting up a trapping network to protect whio, takahē, roro/greatspotted kiwi and other native species, Malham said.

Currently, whio pairings have been found mostly around security site rivers where stoat trapping is supplemented with aerial 1080 predator control, Malham said.

"The average pair density on rivers with both forms of predator control was 0.76 pairs per kilometre, compared with 0.58 pairs per kilometre with 1080 alone and 0.12 pairs per kilometre before predator control."

The increase hasn't come without its downfalls, with climate change and repeated flooding impacting breeding spaces, and a "mega beech mast" in 2019 which saw a number of rodents, stoats and feral cats invade the area.

Aerial 1080 predator control was carried out over a large part of the park during this time, but it wasn't possible to cover all the park.

Currently, DOC staff have walked over 700km of the waterways in Kahurangi and while exact numbers of whio aren't possible, staff are "highly encouraged" by the increase they have seen so far.

Notes for Hunters from the Department of Conservation Motueka District Office

Hi NZDA members,

I hope all are well and have been successful in the back country.

Starting Nov 14th 2023 we (DOC) are ground hunting goats using dogs in these areas:

Tasman Wilderness Area (Spey, Roaring Lion rivers), Cobb Valley, Devil Anatoki Ranges (Waingaro, Stanley and Anatoki rivers), Flora valley, and Mt Owen including the Wangapeka and Fyfe rivers.

Two companies will be delivering this piece of work - Backcountry and Kahurangi Contracting Ltd.

The hunting will be completed by Dec 23rd (earlier if the weather is favourable).

Anyone wanting to add to their goat tail line may want to try the Riwaka River south branch or the Pearse Valley. Both a short drive from Nelson and Motueka...

How to apply

April to May 2024 ballot

Applications for this ballot open online on 1 November 2023 and close on 30 November 2023.

The draw will take place in December 2023 and party leaders will be advised of the results by the end of January 2024.

Before applying you need to know:

- full name, address and phone number for each member of your party
- your preferred hunting blocks in order of preference from 1-5
- preferred month
- the email address of the party leader.

Only one application per party is permitted. Individual hunters should not apply on more than one ballot form – any hunter found on more than one form will have all applications removed from the ballot.

A maximum of four hunters are permitted per block; any parties with fewer than four members will have the remaining places allocated to another party.

Fish and Game News

NELSON MARLBOROUGH FISH & GAME REPORT

DESIGNATED WATERS LICENCE COMPLIANCE: Staff have been active over the first month of the season undertaking compliance and collecting angler use data on our new Designated Water (DW) fisheries: Travers River, Matakitaki River (above Horse Terrace Bridge) and Upper Wairau (above Six Mile Creek). We have also been active on the Wangapeka, which we hope to bring into the DW regime next season. Pleasingly, all anglers we have spoken to have been fully compliant with the new regulation. **DRIFT DIVE SEASON UNDERWAY:** Our drift dive programme has kicked off, with staff diving the Upper Motueka, Maitai and Opouri rivers so far. We will aim to complete dives on 15-20 rivers this season, with many of the rivers having multiple sites, so around 30 km of water will be surveyed this season.



TRAP LINES: The Moturoa/Rabbit Island volunteer group have been active each month checking traps at Rabbit Island. Our line here ties in nicely with the Battle for the Banded Rail project (a Tasman Environment Trust project that has a network of over 900 traps). We are also involved with Farmers 4 Whio in the Motueka Valley - a group that is doing great work to benefit the whio population with the goal that more are living adjacent to farmland areas in the Motueka Valley + tributaries. We are assisting with a trap line in the Skeet Valley, which is one line in a network of around 20 lines in operation: fantastic work from Farmers 4 Whio.

COOKING FOR A GOOD CAUSE: Recently, Fish & Game and Phil Hazeldine from Club Waimea (with help from volunteers) cooked up 60ks of game bird casserole for families in need, with meat supplied by game bird hunters. We aim to do this again soon with meat from the Molersworth Goose Hunt - thanks to NZDA for the use of the metal detector to remove steel shot.


