Last edition the proposed OSPRI national TB vector (possum & etc) control plan was mentioned. Since then, solid submissions have been lodged by our Branch (thanks David Haynes for drafting) in collaboration with Marlborough Branch' and both National NZDA and GAC have submitted comprehensively on the concerns regarding affects to deer and kea alike (and other animals of course) of broadscale aerial 1080 programmes and especially where repellent is not used.

Public submissions are a part of democratic process as in the same manner as voting. Not exercising the right to submit is seen by the proposers at worst as "silence is approval" or at least as "apathy/don't care". Neither holds true! so we must and do respond or be dis-enfranchised! Our submissions remain as ongoing public record of our principle and details views and suggestions for these types or operations (and of course other matters which we advocate on e.g., firearms policy, access and etc.

The upcoming Club Night looks tasty! And the BBQ season is coming (we hope!!) It is a great way to get the whole family into the benefits of hunting by making your own tasty treats at home beyond the old usual steak and stews! Please bring any friend (who may not be a member) along!

Kia ora,

On 1 February 2022, new regulations for firearms and ammunition storage and transport came into effect, which affect all standard firearms licence holders.

We've updated the **Secure Storage Guidance for Firearms and Ammunition document** dated June 2022, with better photos so it's easier for our staff and the community to understand the new requirements and see how to comply.

Tip: To open the most recent version of the guide, follow the link to open guide in your browser and then click Ctrl + R to refresh your web browser.

To support the guidance document and the firearms community we've also developed and released a series of video

guides that cover:

- Installation kit basic tools etc required to install a cable lock system or a steel safe
- Overview of general property security things to consider to increase overall security at home
- Basic cable lock system describes what it is and how to install it. Used for securing a single firearm only to a dwelling
- Steel safe considerations and physical installation of a steel gunsafe
- Secure ammunition storage complying with new law that states firearms and ammunition are to be stored separately
- Firearms in Motorhomes considerations for security of firearms in motorhomes/caravans and physical installation of a gunsafe into a motorhome
- Semi-automatic firearms transport considerations when transporting semi-automatic (or other types that do not have easily removable working parts) firearms
- Bolt action firearms transport considerations when transporting bolt action firearms
- Firearms in unattended vehicles complying with new laws in relation to stopping for a break in a journey when transporting firearms.

The guidance and videos are available under the Firearms and Safety section of the Police website.

I ask that you please share this information with your networks. The videos will be of particular interest to those who transport firearms for hunting or recreational purposes.

Regulations for Clubs and Ranges

While training for staff involved in regulating and inspecting clubs and ranges has continued. The actual regulations have still to be made public and we still don't know what fees will be applied.

A possible solution to the Firearm Licence delays

In a reply to questions raised by Act MP Nicole Mckee police minister Hon Chris Hipkins has said he will make law changes to alleviate the situation and flatten out the "bell curve" of renewals that peaks every 10 years.

"Police are under a lot of pressure when it comes to firearms licence renewals and new applications as well, and that is a result of the decisions that this **Parliament** has made to make it more difficult for people to get firearms licences and to have their licences renewed." he said in the House.

Piecemeal Police gun crime data a 'dangerous embarrassment'

The Council of Licensed Firearm Owners (COLFO) says piecemeal publication of firearm crime data masks incompetent data collection by Police, increases public firearm fear, and hides the failure of the firearm confiscation programme. A story by the NZ Herald tries to make the best of data obtained from a Police database started in 2019, pretentiously called the 'Gun Safe' project. The data was promised to be public and easily accessible to help guide policy.

COLFO Spokesperson Hugh Devereux-Mack said the data had not been regularly released in full, forcing media and stakeholders like COLFO to request data under the Official Information Act.

"The failure to consistently record and report firearm data is a dangerous embarrassment."

The GunSafe data includes all manner of events, even callouts where firearms are never found. Even the Police Association noted in 2020 that recording of events is erratic. Data reliability is undermined by broad criteria that leads to 'events' being entered into the GunSafe system. Entries include times a firearm is suspected but not present, times where there is a 'perceived firearms risk' but no actual firearm involved, times a subject is known to have a firearm – but Police do not encounter one, and for events when there is something that looks like a real firearm but isn't.

This means even courtesy visits to a licensed firearm owner's home can be www.nzdanelson.co.nz

classified as an 'event' within the system, inflating the numbers unnecessarily. These Gun Safe numbers have been used to argue for general armament of police which COLFO and other organisations spoke out against.

Event details are either combined in rough categories or inputted into free text fields which Police noted in an OIA response to COLFO last year, made it too time consuming to formulate into more useful data.

"This poor reporting has created an unnecessary fear of licensed firearm owners, and misdirected efforts to deal with criminal use of firearms."

"It has prevented the public from seeing that despite Government promises that the grandiose firearm confiscation would make New Zealanders safer, firearm crime has continued unchanged."

"It has prevented the public from seeing the inability of Police to collect this data." "Because of the inconsistent Gun Safe reporting framework, the data has possibly hidden a failure to catch and prosecute enough criminals who have firearms, and lays a poor foundation for costly new legislation" Devereux-Mack says.

COLFO supports frontline officers and their work on operation Tauwhiro which is necessary to tackle criminal use of firearms. Devereux-Mack says this is where Police should be investing their efforts and not the administration of the firearms licensing system where Police have shown that they are an inefficient disaster.

COLFO urges all licensed firearm owners to provide feedback to police on these proposed regulations. **Submissions close on 12 October 2022**

Your first firearm or ammunition sale or purchase after June 2023 will trigger a requirement to register ALL your firearms within 14 days.



There's some left....



A Cunning Plan for Victor! by Alan Drake

One of the worst things to happen to somebody trying to trap critters, is the trap getting sprung and nothing getting caught (or all the bait gone...that's also very annoying)...there's nothing worse! After making boxes, buying traps, baiting them, not to mention talking-it-up to the kids about how effective all this will be; to then wander round checking them and finding one sprung with nothing in it, really is quite disappointing. The kids also think you've done a crap job and don't know what you're doing which doesn't help...

This happened to me once and is how I came to thinking more carefully about the baiting of the old faithful Victor spring trap. The DOC 150 plate traps are not a problem as I simply have a standard mouse trap placed after the 150 trap. When I wasn't sure what sort of rodents had invaded my roof space recently (Mrs 'Trapper' heard something skittering round one night), I simply placed a box with a plate trap AND a mouse trap in the roof. 5 mice ran over that plate trap only to be killed by the waiting mouse trap – excellent! And of course, if <u>Rattus rattus</u> was living up there, the DOC 150 would have fixed him as he headed to the peanut butter laden mouse traps – win win.

The thing is...those 150 traps are 40 bucks each and Wifee is all good about building things with the kids – as long as it's free to minimal cost! Now a Victor trap is \$7 and also awesomely effective on rats but typically not mice due to its dimensions...so, what to do?


Well, it turns out that just simply placing the Pic's peanut butter at the raised arrow at the centre of the yellow activation plate (I still also use the bait area by the hinge) remedies this problem. It's only about 10mm closer to the trap edge overall but makes a big difference. If you **only** use the moulded rectangular area by the hinge for baiting it, which is advised in the instructions, the kill bar goes **over** the entire mouse missing it. Mouse gets massive fright as well as education and never goes near trap again!

Anyway, it's my five cents worth. Sounds simple and I suppose many of you have probably sorted this already. But I just thought I'd mention it in case you've had the horrible 'sprung-with-no-catch' scenario with these Victor traps. The pictures show a couple of mice caught a few days apart...in case you're wondering, that's walnut pieces in the photos, and the brown 'dust' is cinnamon...what mouse or rat wouldn't want to get into that! Have fun []

Fish and Game News

NELSON MARLBOROUGH FISH & GAME REPORT



FISH RELEASES: Pre-season fish releases were undertaken at Lake Argyle & Waimea Park, in time for the new season.

WETLAND PLANTINGS: Fish & Game have been involved with a number of wetland plantings recently, including at Eves Valley - a newly constructed wetland which will also be a balloted hunting spot during the game season. 1000 of 4000 carex were planted recently, with the help of NMIT Trainee Rangers. Another 3000 plants will go in over the next while, then the hard work begins maintaining the plantings. Thanks to Appleton's Tree Nursery for also donating some plants for Eves Valley and Gibbs Rd wetlands.


NEW BEATS FOR UPPER WAIRAU VOLUNTARY BEAT SYSTEM: Two new beats have been added to the Upper Wairau voluntary beat system. The beat system was introduced in 2017 as a response to increasing angler pressure and to reduce incidences of angler conflict. Both new beats are below Six Mile Creek (locked gate) and are about 5.5kms in length - a day's fishing for most.

OPENING DAY FISHING SEASON: In this region, heavy rain leading up to October 1 saw many rivers in flood and not fishable. Experienced anglers can always find fishing, and therefore plenty of effort was directed towards Murchison / Springs Junction / Reefton area where there was more clear water.
