- 1. Check website for opening days and hours
- 2. Be at gate **before** 0900 hrs not after
- 3. All vehicles **must have** headlights on and conform to convoy (i.e. **follow** the duty officer in and out on Sharlands Road these rules are set by landowner/operator and are compulsory
- 4. Ensure you have your membership card and hiviz & hearing protection
- 5. Its wet up there, avoid driving on the grass

Section 3

Travelling with Firearms and Ammunition



3.1 Storage of Firearms in Vehicles During Transportation (r19B)

3.1.1 Overview


- Regulation 19B requires firearms licence holders that are transporting firearms or ammunition in a vehicle on a road or public access way, unless otherwise permitted by a member of the Police, to meet the following requirements:
 - (a) Firearms and ammunition must be concealed from view from outside the vehicle.
 - (b) Firearms must be made inoperable if readily possible by removing the bolt or other vital part. The part should be kept on the licence holder's person or stored out of sight separately from the firearms. If this is not possible (e.g. the firearm is a lever action or semi-automatic or single shot firearm), then the firearms must be fitted with a trigger lock or travel in a locked case or carry bag.
 - (c) Firearms must not be loaded with ammunition in the breach, barrel, chamber or magazine.
 - (d) Ammunition must be stored separately from any firearms and be in a locked glovebox or similar storage area where practicable.

3.1.2 Unattended Vehicles

- Any firearms or ammunition may only be left unattended in a vehicle during a break in a journey for up to 60 minutes provided:
 - (a) The licence holder remains in the immediate area or vicinity of the vehicle.
 - (b) The firearms or ammunition are still secured and out of sight.
 - (c) If possible, vital parts of the firearms remain in the licence holder's possession.
 - (d) The vehicle is locked, windows are closed and keys remain in the licence holder's possession.

Meat From the "Big Chiller" - Richard Wells

After an escapade last year into the Leaderdale area in Molesworth, we decided to repeat the dose but with brave intentions to spend more time in there and come out more heavily laden with venison (and pork?). Once again, the plan was to fit in with our mates John and Lee, who have horses and mules (and the necessary permits) to get us across the Clarence and transport meat out. Best laid plans and all, but for a while the snow looked like it might stop us getting over Jacks Pass let alone up the gully. In the end it melted off enough, so we got going but with a revised plan to day hunt only.



Crossing the Clarence while keeping the legs and feet dry is a damn good thing on a morning that is as chilly as this looks, and was! John, Ros and Bruno across.

After two water crossings, with a horse a bit twitchy about our pack straps tickling its rear and manuka sticks tapping its ears while climbing aboard (bloody greenhorns!), we then trekked up gully on foot with the going easy, but bloody noisy, on a solid but crunchy snow crust.

The usual symphony from geese and parries echoed all around too, felt like the whole valley was in an uproar. Little could we guess that a brisk but decisive engagement was looming just over the spur.....



Luck was on our side as a mob situation (more than one deer) developed and in a brief salvo all three of us managed to drop a deer (2 hinds and a spiker) with Ros sighting and shooting the first one as it stepped from the small patch of beech, the last not quite making the pine tree on the ridge. A yearling got over the spur, educated.



A milestone for me as despite many successful and enjoyable trips into Molesworth this is my first deer there! I had to jettison fogged up glasses and managed the shot from the ridge in background so pretty happy with that (ecstatic actually...). The 22-250 is a good round in this open country The other two succumbed to Ros' super trusty 7mm-08 and Dorje's .223. They're <u>all good!</u>



Well flies weren't an issue! And it was only 9 am, so we really took our time and did the fully monty extraction of hearts, livers and eye steaks as well as the legs and back steaks. Left the necks which was a bit regrettable as they make epic curries & stews (looked heavy). The hooves are just posing.



We got 12 legs and all the bits and bobs down and over first creek and had an early lunch before the next heave to valley floor. Still not a fly in sight....after radio call in, John wanted us to get everything well down the hill as the deeper and thawing snow is a bit treacherous for the 4-legged friends.

We "manned up" to a heavy load each so that we didn't have to do two trips.....this is about the time the manuka stick comes in handy doing the downhill under load, the rest of the time it's a pain in the bum really – but it's a worse pain in the hip not having it. The sunnies were mission critical too.

Coxy's Corner – Notes for Hunters from DOC Motueka District Office



NZDA hunters.

I hope all are fit and well and have been getting out there...

I'd like to give you all a heads up regarding the **goat control** our DOC Office is planning on delivering from now this year through to June 2026.

Ground Goat Control Kahurangi National Park

We will have 12 contract goat hunters and 1 staff hunter all with dogs operating in the Mt Arthur Tableland, Wangapeka valley, Mt Owen, Fyfe river, South Branch Wangapeka river, Grecian River, Flora Valley, Anatoki /Devil Ranges, Haupiri Range including the Snow river, Brown river, Flanagan's creek (Aorere valley), upper Big river, upper Turimawiwi, Leslie/Karamea Valleys, and Riwaka South Branch. This ground hunting is mostly planned from November through to mid - December. A notice will be issued on the DOC Hunting Website.

Aerial Goat Control

Arthur Range, South Branch Riwaka, Leslie/Karamea Valleys, Mt Owen, Hoaryhead. This aerial control may commence in September and will be completed by the end of June 2026.

Goat Hunting Competition

Recommended areas to fill your goat tail lines are, Lower Aorere River, Gordons Knob via Inwoods Lookout, the Te Araroa Trail between Mt Starveall and Hunters Hut, Ben Nevis via Left Branch Wairoa, Left Branch Wairoa river via Wairoa MTB Park, Mt Duppa, Pearse valley, Browning - Roebuck track area.
