Hopefully this excites some interest to hunt in this relatively hard to access area. Note this access is not exclusive, it relates to ability to fly in only. Normal permit conditions apply to foot access hunters.

Thanks to Ian Cox and Brent Hartshorne of DOC, supported by Mike DeGray, for getting more dogs kiwi aversion trained. Recent headlines up north show dog attacks on kiwi causing real concern, so getting your hunting dog trained and certified is a good thing to do.





# **Nelson Lakes Hunting Opportunity**



# Nelson Lakes National Park Ungulate Control - Terms and Conditions

# **Background**

The primary objective of this hunting is to reduce the effects of deer browse (by reducing the deer population) threatening the indigenous flora and fauna in Nelson Lakes National Park (NLNP).

Deer numbers in the southern part of Nelson Lakes, including the Spenser Mountains, Ella Range and Nardoo area, are rapidly increasing. Reports suggest walk-in hunting is not controlling the numbers with herds upwards of 15 hinds in these areas. In the Nelson Lakes National Park Bylaws 2006 helicopters are only allowed to land in the national park for management purposes, search and rescue and WARO at certain times of year. The Rotoiti/Nelson Lakes district is facilitating heliassisted recreational hunter access further into the park as a method of controlling deer numbers.

For those that have taken part in this initiative before please read carefully as some of the conditions have changed. We will trial new aspects this year and reserve the right to change how this program is run at any time.

# **The Proposal**

The block is the southernmost section of Nelson Lakes National Park including the area west of the D'Urville River, the Ella Range, the Spenser Mountains south of Thompson Pass and Nardoo Creek. This area is outside the most popular tramping tracks (the Travers-Sabine Circuit and the Te Araroa trail) in Nelson Lakes National Park.

The target is to remove as many deer, goats, chamois and pigs as possible through recreational hunting during this period. Helicopter access allows hunters to target their efforts, remove meat from kills and minimise waste. With the help of hunters, we can reduce animal numbers and allow the vegetation to recover providing a healthy ecosystem for all our native species.

More intensive game animal management in the park will also be beneficial for future hunting potential. When the sex ratio becomes more female biased (when only large stags are targeted) this can reduce genetic variation and reduce the future viability of the population. Additionally, when the density of deer is lower the individuals in the population are healthy and larger. The Game Animal Council New Zealand has useful information about herd management.

This year we will run blocks from Saturday to Saturday and we will be alternating blocks. Blocks start/change over date: 21<sup>st</sup> October (even), 28<sup>th</sup> October (odds), 4<sup>th</sup> November (even), 11<sup>th</sup> November (odds). The 18<sup>th</sup> of November will be the final flights out.

Kill returns are required through a hunting diary (and photos appreciated) as a means of monitoring the success of this hunting activity. If hunting parties do not provide DOC Nelson Lakes with a hunting diary, they will not be considered for this program for the following 2 years. Checks will be carried out on landing sites to ensure there are no unfavourable impacts.

# **Conditions of Entry**

- All hunters entering must hold a current firearms license <u>and</u> obtain a hunting permit prior to entering Nelson Lakes National Park <u>huntingpermits.doc.govt.nz</u>
- The focus is on hunting game animals and is not for those who seek aircraft access into the National Park for other purposes no fishing is permitted by those flying in.
- Parties must be flown in but can have the option to walk out from a block.
- All equipment flown in must be taken out, along with <u>all</u> rubbish. Checks on landing sites will be carried out to ensure they have been left tidy with campfire sites dismantled.
- Campsite and landing sites are not designated but will be recorded.
- Each party leader must make their own transport arrangements and pay for helicopter access with one of the authorised operators.
- A hunting diary is required for each party. Each party MUST provide a hunting diary to DOC at the conclusion of their trip. Photos of kills would be appreciated.
- Maximum party size is up to six hunters.
- Hunters must only hunt within their allocated blocks for the duration of the hunting trip.
- All hunting parties are required to carry an inReach device.
- Changeover of hunting parties will be based on helicopter availability (or arrangements made with pilots). Seven-day (six-nights) blocks of time have been identified for hunting parties.
- No spot lighting or night vision gear is permitted.
- This is not to facilitate paying client's entry individual recreational hunters only.
- No chainsaws, building materials or structures (other than tents) are permitted.
- If using huts, these are on a 'first come, first served' basis so all parties must also be prepared
  to camp if the huts are full and have purchased the appropriate hut tickets/backcountry hut pass
  for those huts.
- Carcasses or offal must not be left at, or in the vicinity of tracks, huts, campsites or in waterways.
- No damage to vegetation is permitted and only dead wood can be used for campfires.
- All toilet waste needs to be buried at least 50 metres clear of running water.
- No hunting dogs will be permitted. No dogs are permitted in Nelson Lakes National Park.
- Nelson Lakes National Park is relatively free of introduced weeds. You are asked to CLEAN
  gear and boots carefully, so no seeds or dirt is accidentally introduced. Special care is needed
  to clean tents, day packs, pack pockets, socks and Velcro fasteners that often carry seeds.
  Random gear checks may be carried out before you leave the hangar.

Heli ferry options: We have secured a location at Mt Ella station where hunting parties could park up and it can be used as a site to ferry groups to and from hunting blocks. This will hopefully reduce times and cost of helicopter flights for the groups.

# **Safety Information**

Pilots will brief all passengers on helicopter safety prior to take off - decisions around flights, landings and weight will be made with the helicopter operators.

Ensure all group members have adequate backcountry skills for the terrain. This is rough terrain where good navigation skills are essential. Ensure the hunting party has adequate first aid supplies and each group has the ability to quickly call for help if required (e.g. inReach device, PLBs are available for hire from the NLNP Visitors Centre).

Weather can change quickly, and snow can fall at any time of the year. Heavy rain may make streams dangerous to cross. Ensure provisions are made in the event helicopters cannot pick you up on the designated date.

Carry additional food in case flights are delayed due to adverse weather conditions. Hunting parties will be permitted to stay in their block for longer or over the permitted period for helicopter landings if the weather conditions delay helicopter pick-ups.

German and common wasp numbers are expected to be high within the beech forest. Carry adequate medication if you are at risk. You need to manage your own wellbeing within your limits.

Other trampers, fishers and hunters may have walked into the hunting area. You do not have exclusive access to your hunting area from such users - this hunting permission provides individuals with the opportunity to fly further into the park and access areas with low hunting pressure currently. Usual firearm safety codes need to be followed at all times.

Please notify <u>nelsonlakeshunting@doc.govt.nz</u> directly of <u>any</u> incidents or 'near misses' during your hunting period, so we can make any necessary changes to prevent incidents.



- 5. Take the unique code and allocated block you receive from Melissa Griffin at Nelson Lakes Hunting to book with one of the approved helicopter operators (a list will be provided)
- 6. The party lead will be emailed a form with the necessary data to be collected on the hunting trip.

- A valid Import Permit


### What firearms can I carry?

- Sporting firearms
- · Air rifles, air pistols and BB guns
- · Soft air pellet guns and paintball guns
- Imitation firearms
- Decommissioned firearms

### How do I pack my firearm for air travel?

You must ensure your firearm is:

- Packed in a locked, hard case
- Unloaded and any fitted magazines emptied
- Rendered inoperable e.g. bolt removed, trigger guard(s)/trigger lock(s) fitted etc
- Not packed with any ammunition
- Not packed with the bolt (if applicable)
- Is declared to a Customer Service Agent when you check-in



# **Goats Starting to get a Good Curry-Up**



Essentially a fool-proof recipe for cooking goat curry that you can adjust to your taste. The key is cooking it for a few hours on low and then adding ingredients to balance flavours to your taste, as well as adding butter/oil to add richness to your wild game meal (according to the fattiness of your goat).

### Ingredients:

- Goat (cut into bite size pieces, can have bones in)
- Onion x1
- Garlic x1 Tbs
- Ginger x1 Tbs
- Spices: Garam Masala 1x Tbs, ground coriander 1x Tbs, ground cumin 1x Tbs, Turmeric x1
   Tsp, chilli x1 Tsp, bay leaf
- Stock (vegie, beef or chicken) 500ml
- Tomatoes x1 can (or use some tomato paste or fresh tomatoes)
- Vinegar x1 Tbs or tamarind paste x1 Tsp
- Salt + Pepper
- Oil/butter

### Optional:

- Coconut cream/milk x1 can
- Tomato sauce/ sugar
- Fresh chilli



### Optional:

### Method:

- 1. Fry off goat chunks and put in slow cooker or big pot
- 2. Fry off onion, garlic, chilli, ginger in plenty of oil and butter
- 3. Add spices and seasonings and fry around 5 mins until onions are soft then add to pot
- 4. Add stock, tomatoes, vinegar or tamarind, add coconut cream if you want a milder taste to your curry otherwise leave out



- 1. Cook for 4 or more hours in slowcooker or less time if pot on the stove until meat is tender
- 2. When it has been cooking for a few hours, do a taste check. To balance out the spice of the curry (sour, sweet and salty) add either more vinegar or sugar/tomato sauce or salt to your liking
- 3. Keep cooking with the lid off to reduce it to thicken it and skim off fat as desired. Serve when it tastes good enough for you.
- 4. Serve with rice and/or roti.

This ballot is to ensure hunters have access to an area, with the knowledge that only one hunting party will be in each of the blocks for a seven-day period.

Hunters using a firearm must abide by the New Zealand Police Arms Code and the Arms Act 1983 and have a valid firearms licence.

### Roar 2024 updates

- A one-off non-refundable fee of \$40 will be charged for each application.
- Children / youths may not apply unless over 16 and holding a valid firearms licence.
- Bow hunters wanting to apply in the ballot must contact the Haast Hunting Ballot team before putting in an application.
- · Party leaders:
  - o can only enter one application
  - who apply for a ballot must be intending to hunt the block with their party
  - o need to supply a photo of their valid New Zealand firearms licence with their confirmation
  - o are responsible for all party members adhering to permit conditions.

**Important**: Party leaders applying and successfully gaining a ballot on the behalf of others but have no intention of attending will not be tolerated. Party leaders and members found doing this will have all permits cancelled.

In 2024, the roar ballot hunting periods will run from Sunday 24 March 2024 to Sunday 21 April 2024.

Available periods:

- Period 1 Sunday 24 March to Saturday 30 March
- Period 2 Sunday 31 March to Saturday 6 April
- Period 3 Sunday 7 April to Saturday 13 April
- Period 4 Sunday 14 April to Saturday 20 April

### Confirmation form returns close 4 pm Monday 30 October 2023

Confirmation forms are emailed out as part of the successful email notification process.

If you need to update your party details, do so on this form and return by email. All successful ballot holders must respond by email that they accept the ballot. Unconfirmed blocks will be cancelled and made available for rebooking by other parties.






