At Whakatu Te Korowai Manaakitanga Trust, amongst other services, we support whanau with their finances.

Our team of Financial Mentors is passionate about supporting whānau towards their financial awareness and independence. We have a Goals oriented approach, with a strong focus on empowering whanau making their own choices.

Financial mentors are committed to providing a quality service which will make a positive difference to whanau and will help them to have increased financial capability.

As volunteer you will be given the chance to get a qualification as Building Financial Capability Mentor (Through Fincap) and will be given the opportunity to learn about financial mentoring, becoming competent in areas such as: budgeting, money and debt management, advocacy, Insolvencies Procedures, Consumer Protection issues, cultural diversity. All within a Kaupapa Maori approach and our organisation values.

The 4 hours a week volunteer will include one on one with whanau, required admin and supervision.

In order to gain the BFC Mentor qualification you will be assigned a tutor and a supervisor.

The programme is 16 credits so around 160 hours over the 11 modules and assessment + another hour per module for self-directed study/assignments.

- Budgeting
- Financial Mentoring
- Debt management

Skills acquired: Advocacy, Budgeting, Communication Skills, Financial Literacy, Financial Planning, Interpersonal Skills, and Mentoring.
