What's happening now?

Career Development in Secondary Schools

Currently, career development is:

- under-funded;
- not standardised or regulated; and
- not woven into curricula.

Therefore, young people are:

- receiving inequitable access;
- influenced by the biases of untrained practitioners; and
- unable to contextualise their learning in the world of work.

Rangatahi feel unprepared when leaving school.

"The only limit to your success is your own imagination!"


Rangatahi are both uninspired and overwhelmed by the world of work.

My journey in the world of work begins in hospitality and tourism.




2019-20 Education

I begin tertiary study.




2021 Career Development

My governance portfolio grows.




2022-Organisational Development

Kauri's Pathway




